

RESEARCH FELLOWSHIP

The Montana State Historic Preservation Office (SHPO) partnered with the University of Montana and Montana State University to offer a RESEARCH FELLOWSHIP for enrolled graduate students.

STUDENT AND FACULTY AWARDS

The Fellow will receive \$3,000 and waived tuition for up to three credits for effectively incorporating SHPO's online cultural records and GIS files into their research. A mentoring faculty member can earn an additional \$1,000 for pursuing publication. The Fellow's resultant scholarly research paper or comparable product will be added to Montana's Cultural Resource Database.

INFORMATIONAL WEBINARS

Interested candidates are encouraged to attend an orientation webinar held four to six weeks before application deadlines. SHPO and University staff will demonstrate how to use the database and answer questions.
